The introduction of non-native species through human agency has been repeatedly identified as one of the major threats to biodiversity. The dimension of this so-called biological invasion is immense and increasing with no sign of saturation. In this presentation, I will give an overview of the current state of biological invasions worldwide with a focus on large-scale spatial distributions of non-native species and the temporal changes over recent centuries. As the distribution of non-native is tightly coupled to human activities, I will present ways how to make use of the tremendous amount of data available for human activities such as global and national transportation systems to predict the occurrence of non-native species in space and time. Finally, I will discuss uncertainties of predictions due to data deficiencies and lack of knowledge.
